Antonio Gomez was born in Guadalajara, Jalisco, México on November 18th, 1965. He studied industrial engineering at the University of Guadalajara. It was during Antonio's studies at university the he decided to nurture his artistic abilities by enrolling in Contemporary Art Concepts along with Art History and Museology.

Antonio's interest in art began to really bloom, when he and a small group of friends studied techniques in acrylic, oil and other media at the Roxy Cultural Center in Guadalajara. It was here that Antonio picked up pointers on art criticism and sculpting.

He would later study Prehispanic Art under his friend and mentor, Dr. Ayotl.

In 2005, Antonio opened his studio in San Antonio where he has produced the bulk of his artwork. Antonio enjoys collaborating on projects with fellow artists and opened his Studio in 2006 & 2007 to join the First Friday Art Walk. He has also had the privilege to work with organizations such as Blue Star Art Center and the Instituto de Mexico San Antonio.




